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

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FESTIVAL GENERAL RULES

Please comply with General Rules as well as specific rules and directives that accompany each section and class in the Syllabus. Those entering Dance are asked to comply with Dance Rules.

FESTIVAL GOVERNANCE

- 1) The Festival is the signature project of the Kiwanis Club of Stratford, which incorporated the Kiwanis Music Festival Charitable Trust in 1967. The Festival is managed by a Festival Organizing Committee, hereinafter called the "Committee", whose executive members are Kiwanis Club members designated as Festival Trustees by the Club.
- 2) The Committee is empowered to hire an Executive Director to manage the festival and its programs.
- 3) Decisions of the Committee in any matters not specified within the rules shall be final and binding.

NON-PROFESSIONAL STATUS

- 4) All classes are for non-professionals only.
- 5) Non-professionals are persons whose principal means of livelihood is not obtained from performance in the particular discipline in which he or she is competing. A person may be a professional in one discipline but still participate as an amateur in another discipline. For example, a professional actor may perform in a music class.
- 6) Participants who only receive occasional remuneration for musical, theatrical or dance services performed are considered nonprofessional.
- 7) For the purpose of this Festival, a professional is any person with a demonstrable career in performance, teaching, or adjudication, with current or prior membership in a professional organization such as ORMTA, or with a current or former full membership in a professional union such ACTRA or Equity.
- 8) Final determination of a participant's non-professional or professional status, considered as a whole or with respect to a single discipline, rests with the Executive Director.
- 9) Participants uncertain as to their non-professional or professional status should contact the Festival Office for clarification before registering in the Festival.

REGISTRATION

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- 10) All 2023 registration must be done online at www.kiwanisfestivalstratford.com. Teachers, coaches and parents may register participants but please ensure that mailing addresses and emails are provided for each participant.
- 11) Live entries must be completed including payment by January 23, 2023. Early bird pricing for those who complete entries by January 16, 2023. Virtual entries must include scans of music, links to recorded performance(s), and payment and be completed by March 27, 2023.
- 12) All registrations must be accompanied by the specified fee(s).
- 13) In duets, trios, and ensemble classes, only one entry registration is required for the group. The name, age, email address and city of residence of each member of a small ensemble must be included on the registration. Large ensembles such as choirs, bands and orchestras are not required to list every member.
- 14) Participants may only register competitively once in the same class. i.e. in a duet class, a singer may not perform in two separate duet entries.

FESTIVAL GENERAL RULES (con't)



- 15) Any class can be entered non-competitively. Please contact the office to register as a non-competitive participant.
- 16) Due to planning and expenses, once entries have been processed entry fees cannot be refunded.
- 17) By submitting an entry, the participant, parent/guardian and teacher agree to abide by all festival rules.

ELIGIBILITY

- 18) In classes where an age limit is specified, participants must be of the stated age as of December 31, 2022.
- 19) Duets, trios, ensembles and groups are asked to average their ages, then round down to the nearest age class.
- 20) Participants in choirs, orchestras or bands must be bona fide members of their organizations.
- 21) Conductors may be professional, and may conduct any number of organizations in the same class, but must not sing with their choir, or play with their band. (Jazz ensembles are the exception to this rule.)
- 22) Participants studying with an adjudicator during the current Festival year (Oct 1, 2022 to Sept 30, 2023) will not be eligible to compete in solo classes adjudicated by their teacher.
- 23) The Festival defines two categories of ensemble: a small (or chamber) ensemble is any ensemble with two, three, four, five or six members; a large ensemble is any ensemble with seven or more members.

TEST PIECES AND PERFORMANCE

- 24) Unless otherwise indicated, participants must have access to a digital copy of the sheet music for the adjudicator. The festival expects all participants, teachers and coaches to respect copyright; we ask that the material you provide be from purchased, not photocopied, sources. If you purchase and download music online, please have proof of purchase available.
- 25) If the participant neglects to provide their music or text, they will receive adjudication but no mark or placement. In Pop Voice or other cases where published music may not exist, we ask participants to provide confirmation that a published version is unavailable (ie. Letter from Long & McQuade). Participants are asked to write out the music or create a chord chart (with applicable lyrics) for the adjudicator.
- 26) Please include measure numbers at the beginning of each line of your score if requested by adjudicator.
- 27) Selections for solo competitive classes must be memorized, unless otherwise stated. Disciplines where memorization is not required include all Pop classes, Percussion, Brass/Woodwinds, String Sonatas, Unaccompanied Strings, and all Non-Competitive classes. If a participant uses music in a solo competitive class, they will be considered non-competitive, receiving adjudication but no mark or placement.
- 28) RCM refers to the Royal Conservatory of Music in Toronto; CC refers to Conservatory Canada in London. If neither Conservatory is referenced, RCM or CC is assumed.
- 29) When RCM and CC are specified, participants must use the appropriate syllabi criteria (i.e. number of movements required).
- 30) Participants must perform at their current level of study or higher, but not lower. Participants may only perform one piece above their level of study. Participants must perform at their current level in Tri-County classes.
- 31) Unless otherwise stated, selections must be performed in the prescribed key. Transpositions are allowed for Choral, Junior Voice, Pop Voice and Musical Theatre classes.
- 32) The time limit for open classes is seven minutes, with the exception of sonatas and concertos.
- 33) Repeats in instrumental solos and duets may be played if the piece still fits within the time limit. A da capo must be observed; please take the second ending.







- 34) We are a family-friendly Festival, please choose material appropriate for all audiences.
- 35) With the exception of Finals, a piece of music or dramatization cannot be used competitively by a participant in more than one class or in more than one year.
- 36) For video submissions: No editing. Recordings must be one single, continuous take. Any submissions with edits will be disqualified. Please do not submit your video; instead, upload to YouTube classified as UNLISTED and NOT MADE FOR KIDS and submit a link to that recording.

PROGRAM PROCEDURE

- 37) The Festival reserves the right to shift a participant from a class in which he or she is the sole participant to an appropriate class with more participants.
- 38) Notifications and correspondence will primarily be done via email. It is the participant's responsibility to provide an active email address. Please ensure that the active email address recognizes info@kiwanisfestivalstratford.com
- 39) Participants in virtual classes will have the opportunity to hear from adjudicators in a Zoom session.
- 40) Participants who elect to perform not with their class may be deemed non-competitive and receive adjudication only with no mark or placement.
- 41) For video submissions, participants may use live or pre-recorded (i.e. tracks) accompaniment. A list of accompanists and websites for tracks is available from the office upon request at info@kiwanisfestivalstratford.com.
- 42) A chord may be given on the piano at the commencement of each piece of unaccompanied music.

AWARDS AND PRIZES

- 43) In order to preserve a high standard in all classes, an award winner must achieve the following minimum marks: a. first prize 80% b. second and third prize 75%. Unless these marks are obtained, awards may be withheld regardless of the number of participants. Participants with marks of 90% and higher will receive "First Class Honours with Distinction".
- 44) To advance to the Finals, participants must earn a minimum of 83% in qualifying classes. To be considered for the OMFA Provincial Finals, a minimum mark of 85% must be obtained in at least one class.
- 45) To be considered for the OMFA Provincial Finals or for a major cash prize, participants are strongly advised to enter at least three solo classes in the same discipline.
- 46) Trophies and awards are presented at the discretion of the adjudicator and the Committee. Trophies and awards may be transferred from one discipline to another at the discretion of the Committee.
- 47) Trophies winners may keep the trophy for a year and will receive a plaque to keep.
- 48) Monetary awards will be paid by EFT.
- 49) Decisions of the adjudicators are final.

FESTIVAL COMMUNICATIONS - GENERAL

- 50) Due to the number of participants in the Festival, the Festival will communicate almost exclusively via email with participants and ensembles, parents or guardians, and teachers and administrators. As such, all persons or organizations who intend to receive communications from the Festival must have a valid email address that they refer to on a regular basis.
- 51) The Festival will also make information available on its website and via social media accounts operated by the Festival.

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FESTIVAL GENERAL RULES (con't)



- 52) By submitting an entry, participants, parents/guardians and teachers agree to receive, from time to time, notices from the Festival via email. An "unsubscribe" option, allowing you to cease receiving any further notices, will be clearly visible on each such communication.
- 53) The Festival values the privacy of all registrants, their teachers, parents or guardians, and administrators. All contact information collected by the Festival is kept entirely confidential, and at no time will your contact information be rented, sold, shared or used for any purpose other than communicating with you.

COMMUNICATIONS REGARDING THE SYLLABUS

- 54) The Festival reserves the right to alter this syllabus at any time during the Festival year. Once revised, the most recent version of the syllabus will replace the previous version on the Festival website at the earliest opportunity. Changes will be recorded on a page of the Festival website set aside for that purpose. Only when deemed necessary will the Festival issue notices advising of revisions to the syllabus to participants.
- 55) Any questions regarding the rules and regulations set forth in this syllabus must be directed to the Executive Director.

COMMUNICATIONS REGARDING THE PROGRAMME

- 56) The Festival Programme will be available online.
- 57) The Festival reserves the right to make changes to the Festival Programme at any time after its initial publication.
- 58) Only when deemed necessary will the Festival issue notices advising of revisions to the Programme.
- 59) In the event of any disagreement between the Festival Programme and the schedule possessed by the Adjudicator, the Adjudicator's schedule takes precedence.

FESTIVAL PROMOTION

60) By submitting an entry and agreeing to participate in the Festival, participants, parents/guardians and teachers understand and agree that any videos submitted may be used by the Festival solely for the purpose of promoting the Festival.

COMMUNICATING WITH THE FESTIVAL

- 61) Under no circumstances are participants, parents/guardians or teachers to approach adjudicators, adjudicator assistants, or Festival volunteers regarding questions or complaints about the Festival or its rules.
- 62) Questions and complaints during the Festival must be made in writing, either on paper or via email, addressed directly to the Executive Director. Any questions or complaints arising from a circumstance occurring over the course of the Festival must be communicated to the Executive Director within 48 hours of the incident.
- 63) Any matters or circumstances that are found to be not satisfactorily accounted for within the rules and regulations set forth in this syllabus shall be referred to the Executive Director.

FINAL CONCERT

64) Award winners and select participants will be notified by the Festival office if they have been selected to perform in Stars of the Festival, and what format that concert will take in 2023 (i.e. digital, live, or hybrid).

MISCELLANEOUS

65) Recording adjudicators, by any method, is prohibited without prior consent of adjudicator.

RECOMMENDATIONS, COMMENTS, OR COMPLAINTS

66) Please make suggestions or express concerns in writing to the Festival office during the Festival.





Dance Rules & Regulations

Please comply with these rules as well as the General Rules applying to the Festival and specific rules and directives that accompany each section and class in the Syllabus.

MANAGEMENT

- 1) Competitions are under the management of the Kiwanis Festival of the Performing Arts Stratford Executive Committee, hereinafter called the "Committee."
- 2) Decisions of the Committee in any matters not specified within the rules shall be final and binding.

NON-PROFESSIONAL STATUS

- 3) All Competitions are for non-professionals only. Non-professionals are persons whose principal means of livelihood is not obtained from performance in the particular discipline in which he or she is competing. A person may be a professional in one discipline but still participate as a non-professional in another discipline. For example, a professional actor may perform in a music class.
- 4) Participants who only receive occasional remuneration for musical, theatrical or dance services performed are considered non-professional.

REGISTRATION


- 5) All entries must include an active email address for communication purposes.
- 6) Registration forms without accurate performance times will be considered incomplete.
- 7) Dance registrations are due no later than January 23, 2023. An Early Bird Discount applies for entries completed by January 16, 2023.
- 8) All entries must be accompanied by the specified fee(s).
- 9) In duets, trios, and group classes only one entry is required for the group. The name, age, email address and city of residence of a supervisor/chaperone must be provided.
- 10) Once entries have been processed, entry fees will not be refunded.

ELIGIBILITY

- 11) In classes where an age limit is specified, participants must be of the stated age as of December 31, 2022. Please enter the age in the space provided on the entry.
- 12) Duets, trios, ensembles and groups are asked to average their ages, then round up or down to the nearest age class.
- 13) Students studying with an adjudicator during the current Festival year (Oct 1, 2022 to Sept30, 2023) will not be eligible to compete in solo classes adjudicated by their teacher.

PROGRAM PROCEDURE

- 14) The Festival reserves the right to shift a student from a class in which he or she is the sole participant to an appropriate class with more participants.
- 15) Notifications, schedules, and correspondence will primarily be done via email to teachers. If the participant does not have a teacher, then the individual will be notified.
- 16) A scheduling notification is sent to every participant who has entered the Festival.
- 17) We make every effort to accommodate scheduling requests noted on entries. Priority is given to students in a variety of disciplines, or those performing in other festivals.
- 18) Participants who elect to perform not with their class may be deemed non-competitive and receive adjudication only with no mark or placement.





DANCE RULES (con't)



COMPETITION ETIQUETTE

We appreciate our dancers, teachers, parents and audience members showing respect for all others. Please follow these basic rules of etiquette:

- 19) While in the auditorium, please remain seated during all stage performances.
- 20) During competition sessions, dance teachers may address questions to workers at the scoring tables during scheduled breaks.
- 21) Cell phones and pagers must be turned off when in the competition area.
- 22) Please do not consume food and drinks in hallways, dressing rooms or the auditorium.
- 23) Dance studios are asked to keep clean the areas assigned as dressing rooms. Please recycle cans & plastic in the blue bins.
- 24) Dancers should wear a cover-up when not onstage.
- 25) Flash photography is not allowed during performances.
- 26) Above all, dancers, teachers and parents are asked to conduct themselves with decorum, and to demonstrate good sportsmanship throughout the dance competition. Please ensure that your music and dances are appropriate for family enjoyment.

STAGE REGULATIONS

- 27) Routines must be appropriate for families. Mature themes, evocative costumes and coarse language are not acceptable.
- 28) Props are allowed if they are essential to the routine. No weapons, fire, fireworks or live animals are permitted. Please remove props and clean debris from the stage immediately after your performance.
- 29) Only dancers and teachers may go backstage.
- 30) Performers in bare feet must keep their shoes on until waiting in the wings.
- 31) Dancing is a risk sport. Dancers will not hold the Kiwanis Club, its staff, volunteers, or venues responsible for injuries.
- 32) Please comply with these time limits: · Solos, duets, trios 3 minutes · Groups 4 minutes · Production numbers 7 minutes

ELIGIBILITY

- 33) To determine average age for duets, trios and groups, add the ages and divide by the number of dancers. If the average is less than a whole number, round up or down to most appropriate age.
- 34) Proof of age is not required with the entry; however, identification should be available at the competition.
- 35) Novice dancers have not competed in solo, duet or trio classes before (although they may have competed in groups). Novice groups must consist exclusively of novice dancers.
- 36) Recreational dancers are those who have three hours or less per week of dance instruction or practice in any genre. They have competed at the novice level, but never at the competitive level. Recreational groups must consist exclusively of recreational 18) dancers.
- 37) Competitive classes are intended for experienced dancers who have more than three hours per week of dance instruction or practice in any genre. (Most have already competed at novice and recreational levels.)
- 38) Professional dancers are not allowed to compete at this Festival. However, they are welcome to perform for adjudication only.

MUSIC

- 39) Each entrant must provide music in digital format (ie. USB stick) with clear instructions as to studio name, class, music title and name of soloist or dance title. Cassette tapes, CDs and DVDs are no longer acceptable for this competition.
- 40) Teachers are responsible for supplying the music to the audio technician, as well as retrieving it after the dance or session.





DANCE RULES (con't)

AWARDS AND PLACEMENTS

- 41) Dancers, teachers and parents must not discuss scoring or results with adjudicators or tabulators during or after the competition.
- 42) In all genres of dance, students who wish to perform, but not compete for marks or placements, are asked to inform the adjudicators' assistants prior to the session.
- 43) Adjudications will take place on stage during breaks. Medals, ribbons, certificates and prizes will be awarded during these breaks or at the end of each day's competition.
- 44) In order, to preserve a high standard in all classes, an award winner must achieve the following minimum marks: a. first prize 80% b. second and third prize 75%. Unless these marks are obtained, awards may be withheld regardless of the number of participants Performers with marks of 90% and higher will receive "First Class Honours with Distinction".
- 45) Adjudicators' reports are given to performers at the end of each session.
- 46) Decisions of the adjudicators are final.

FINAL CONCERT

47) Performers may be called upon to perform at Stars of the Festival.

MISCELLANEOUS

- 48) Recording adjudicators by any method is prohibited.
- 49) The Kiwanis Club of Stratford and the Kiwanis Festival of the Performing Arts is not responsible for loss of or damage to articles or persons in any of the venues used for the Festival.

RECOMMENDATIONS, COMMENTS, OR COMPLAINTS

50) Please make suggestions or express concerns in writing to the Executive Director during the Festival.







BANDS – COMMUNITY & BRASS

Trevor Wagler has dedicated his life to the art of music. He is co-owner/Director of Renaissance School of the Arts, as well as a freelance French horn player (on both modern and historical instruments), conductor, organist, composer, arranger/orchestrator, music editor/copyist and clinician. Trevor has conducted the historic Waterloo Concert Band since 2006, and has spent nearly two decades conducting various ensembles for the KWS Youth Orchestra Programme. He is the regular guest conductor of the Kitchener-Waterloo Symphony for their acclaimed joint performances with KW Glee. He founded the Kitchener-Waterloo Youth Concert Band (KW YCB) in 2017. Passionate about music education, Trevor maintains an active teaching schedule at Renaissance School of the Arts, and holds contract faculty positions at both Laurier University and the University of Waterloo (Conrad Grebel University College).
